

### زيارة مساعدة نائب كاتبة الدولة الأمريكية لشؤون الشرق الأدنى إلى الجزائر

تطرقت الصحف الوطنية باهتمام كبير، إلى زيارة مساعدة نائب كاتبة الدولة الأمريكية لشؤون الشرق الأدنى إلى الجزائر السيد سندرسون، كونها تأتي عقب وضع الجزائر من طرف الولايات المتحدة الأمريكية وفرنسا، ضمن قائمة الدول الخطيرة، وما صاحبها من ردود فعل جزائرية رسمية وغير رسمية رافضة لتلك الإجراءات ومطالبة بالغاءها. وأبرزت الصحف تصريح السيدة سندرسون، عقب استقبالها من الوزير المنتدب المكلف بالشؤون المغاربية والإفريقية السيد عبد القادر مساهل، الذي قالت فيه بأن الولايات المتحدة الأمريكية ستقيم وتراجع تلك القائمة وفقا للتطورات الدولية. وهو ما اعتبرته بعض الصحف مؤشر ايجابي نحو شطب الجزائر من القائمة المذكورة. ونقلت (آخر ساعة) أن السيد الوزير المنتدب كشف أن الجزائر تلقت ضمانات من الطرف الأمريكي، سواء خلال الاتصال الهاتفي بين وزير الشؤون الخارجية السيد مراد مدلسي ونظيرته الأمريكية أو خلال حديثه مع سندرسون.

### Algeria-US: Counterterrorism fight on the agenda

ALGIERS- Foreign Minister Mourad Medelci had talks Monday in Algiers with US State Department's Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Near Eastern Affairs Janet Sanderson. In a press declaration following their, Ms. Sanderson said she had "good discussions" with Mr. Medelci, mainly about bilateral relations as well as "issues of common interest," such as the fight against terrorism.

Concerning the US watch list of countries whose nationals are subject to extra airport checks, including Algeria, the American diplomat underlined that she is "aware" of the Algerian Government's views on the issue and that she will convey them to US officials in Washington. The new measures are part of a process that can be changed, she added.

### **Algeria experiences notable change in security**

ALGIERS- Algeria is experiencing a noteworthy change and substantial improvement in terms of security, said on January 24, in Algiers US State Department's Deputy Assistant Secretary for Near Eastern affairs Janet Sanderson. "We have noticed a lot of improvement in Algeria at the security level in recent years", Ms Janet Sanderson, former Ambassador to Algeria (from 2000 to 2003), told a news conference held at the US Embassy in the Algerian capital.

"The United States and Algeria have been hit hard by terrorism", she said, adding that "Algeria has made tremendous progress in the fight against this scourge. We highly appreciate the counterterrorism cooperation we have forged with the Algerian Government, which is very strong and stable", she underlined.

### **US air screening list: Modifications to be made, announces Sanderson**

ALGIERS – US Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Near Eastern Affairs Janet Sanderson, announced on January 24, in Algiers that there will be "some modifications" into the American list of countries whose nationals must be subject to US airport security screening measures. "It is a policy that is under revision and that I think that there will some modifications," Sanderson told reporters after her talks with Algerian Deputy Minister for Maghreb and African Affairs Abdelkader Messahel.

Furthermore, she recalled that Algeria, which experienced "a nightmare decade" during the 1990s, has made "much" to counter the scourge of terrorism.
